NIP 2024 - 2025 Financial Highlights 31 October 2025

- NIP total assets increased \$100K since 01 Oct 2024 primarily due to unrealized gain in NIP Vanguard investment portfolio (\$206K).
- Vanguard portfolio distributions since Oct 2024 \$80,780. Distributions taken as cash to augment daily operating expenses account vice reinvested in additional shares.
- 2025 Navy IW Industry Day, co-sponsored with DCNO N2N6 and AFCEA. Net proceeds share \$24,730 up \$2, 360 from 2024.
- Membership dues collected 01 Oct 2024 01 Oct 2025 \$26,900.
 Up 5% since 1 Oct 2024 report.
- Donations since 01 Oct 24 63 donors (down (9%)/\$31,590 (up 6% since 1 Oct 2024). Includes \$5,000 from NIP San Diego Chapter.
- Naval Intelligence Salutes 250th Navy Birthday support \$6,250.
- Awarded seven academic scholarships (\$5,000 each)/one CSi program grant (\$7,700) totaling \$42,700 in CY 2025.
- Partnered with USNI to conduct 2025 Naval Intelligence Essay Contest \$19,000 in prizes/sponsorship/marketing expenses.
- Budgeted CY 2025 expenses for NIP Website/Member Portal/*The READBOOK* \$69,900.
- Projected CY2025 NIP SOY/other awards, ONI/CNO IP special events, chapter and history project support (one grant of \$2,000 provided for Project 2032 admin support) Total \$15,000.



NIP By Laws Article 5.1: The Corporation shall have the following officers: a Chairman/CEO, President, Secretary, Treasurer/CFO and Foundation Committee Chair. Officers will be elected by the members at the annual meeting.

NIP By Laws Article 4.2: The Board of Directors shall consist of not less than seven and not more than twelve Full Members of the NIP, plus the elected officers of the corporation. Elected directors shall be elected for terms of three years. Terms of directors will be staggered in order that approximately one-third of the Board is elected each year.



New Business: Proposed Bylaws Change

NIP Bylaws 4.2 Board of Directors, Number and Term reads in part:

In addition, the incumbents in the positions of Director of Naval Intelligence, Commander of the Office of Naval Intelligence, Senior Intelligence Reserve Flag Officer, and the Senior Enlisted Advisor for ONI, may serve on the Board of Directors, as ex-officio directors without vote. In the event an ex-officio director is unable to attend a Board meeting, a designated representative may be invited by the board to represent him/her.

• Recommend:

In addition, the incumbents in the positions of Director of Naval Intelligence, Commander of the Office of Naval Intelligence, Senior Intelligence Reserve Flag Officer, and the Senior Enlisted Advisor for ONI, Deputy Commandant for Information (DCI), Director of Intelligence (DIRINT), Commander Marine Corps Intelligence Activity, and the Senior Enlisted Advisor to the DCI may serve on the Board of Directors, as ex-officio directors without vote. In the event an ex-officio director is unable to attend a Board meeting, a designated representative may be invited by the board to represent him/her.
