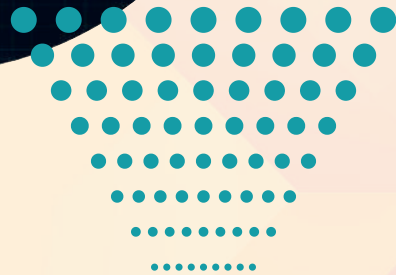
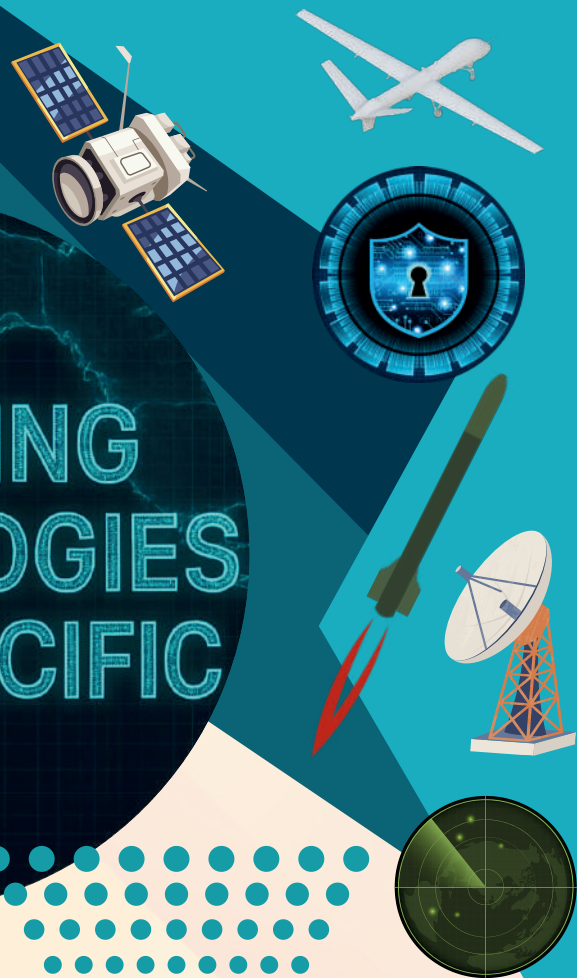

## Commemorative Coin

This year's commemorative coin reflects the vital role of emerging technologies in shaping the Information Warfare Community. The bronze water-textured handle represents IW's enduring connection to afloat operations. The rocket symbolizes our rapid growth as a community, while the satellite and magnifying glass reflect our vigilance and constant watchfulness. At the center of it all, the Officer IW pin highlights the core of our strength: a dedicated corps of warfighters leading this dynamic domain.

The table is small, symbolizing the frailty of one prisoner alone against his oppressors. The tablecloth is white, symbolizing the purity of their motives in answering our country's call to arms

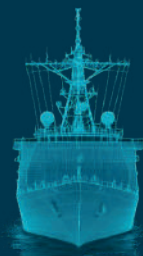
## President of the Mess

# Rules

## of the Mess
